## Introduction

### The Fundació Joan Miró

The Fundació Joan Miró was created by Miró himself, at first principally with works from his own private collection, with a desire to set up an internationally recognised centre in Barcelona for Miró scholarship and contemporary art research, and to disseminate the collection. The Fundació opened to the public on 10 June 1975 and has since become a dynamic centre in which Joan Miró's work coexists with cutting-edge contemporary art.

With an interdisciplinary approach, the Fundació organises temporary exhibitions of twentieth and twenty-first century artists as well as academic activities and projects in collaboration with other institutions and organisations. Through its exhibition and educational programmes, the Fundació Joan Miró explores lines of research linked to the work of Miró and to contemporary art.

The Fundació is located in a building designed by Josep Lluís Sert, making it one of the few museums anywhere in the world in which the complicity between artist and architect underpins the dialogue between the works and the space that houses them. The Fundació offers an overview of the landscapes of Joan Miró's art and life, creating an enriching dialogue with other artists from the twentieth and twenty-first centuries.

## Miró-Gaudí-Gomis

### Summary of the Exhibition

*I consider Antoni Gaudí a master among geniuses*  
Joan Miró, 1936

Joan Miró and Antoni Gaudí both attended the drawing classes held at the Cercle Artístic de Sant Lluc in Barcelona in the 1910s. Although they never met personally, Miró always expressed his admiration for Gaudí's work, valuing the architect's penchant for risk and improvisation.

The two artists viewed nature as the root of all their creative endeavours. Gaudí used it as a source of inspiration for both his ornamental and structural elements. Some of his projects seem to have emerged from the intriguing contours of Montserrat, the jagged mountain so deeply embedded in the Catalan imagination for its magical qualities. Nature, for Miró, was an essential element in his visual and poetic conception, to the point of his stating: "I have even painted directly on huge boulders in order to merge into the elements in this landscape by leaving my mark on them."

Both Gaudí and Miró sought out new procedures and materials, pushed the conventional boundaries of their disciplines, and experimented with sculpture. Following Gaudí's example, Miró cast objects from his everyday surroundings and from nature, working them into his sculptures. Through their assemblage, they transformed into fantastic creatures. He was also drawn to *trencadís*, a folk craft involving repurposed tile shards that he used in his monumental and public pieces and evoked in the *Gaudí Series* prints, which he produced as a tribute to the architect in 1979.

The exhibition features a selection of Miró's sculptures which establish a dialogue with Joaquim Gomis' photographs of Gaudí's architecture. In the 1950s, some of the images were published in what Gomis referred to as his *fotoscops*, a collection of photo books that contributed towards reappraising and drawing broader attention to Gaudí's work. A project supported by Joan Prats and also devoted to other artists such as Miró, the *fotoscops* steer away from a strictly intellectual approach to art, revealing its more human dimension.

In a seemingly intuitive way, Gomis succeeded in capturing the beauty and poetry in the work of these artists, both of whom, drawn to the mysterious power of nature, imbued their works a magical quality which is brought to the fore in this exhibition.

## **Content of the Exhibition**

### **Modern Photographic Prints**

Twenty modern photographic prints by Joaquim Gomis published in the *fotoscops: Encuentro con la obra de Gaudí*, 1967, with a text by Le Corbusier; *Gaudí. La Pedrera*, 1971, with an essay by Michel Tapié and *Park Güell de A. Gaudí*, 1971, with a text by C. Giedion-Welcker. All of them published by Ediciones Polígrafa, Barcelona.

The photographs feature noteworthy architectural details from some of Gaudí's most iconic buildings, such as La Pedrera, the Sagrada Família, the Casa Batlló and the Park Güell.

### **Photo Books: The Fotoscops**

Four *fotoscops* by Joaquim Gomis, dedicated to Gaudí's architecture: a selection of projects, Park Güell, La Pedrera and the Crypt of the Colònia Güell. As well as two copies of *Atmósfera Miró* (1959) dedicated to Miró.

### **Drawings**

Two drawings from the archives of Fundació Joan Miró. One of them a self-portrait of Joan Miró made in 1938 and the model for the *Mosa of Pla de l'Os*, 1976, located in Las Ramblas, Barcelona.

### **Ceramics and Sculptures**

One ceramic made in 1956 in collaboration with the artisan Josep Llorens Artigas and eight bronze sculptures, produced between 1949 and 1970 in collaboration with several foundries: Fundició Gimeno and Fundició Parellada, in Barcelona, and Fonderie T. Clementi in Meudon, Paris.

### **Prints**

The complete *Gaudí Series* includes 21 etching and aquatint prints, some with added collage and/or carborundum, in a variety of sizes. A total of 65 prints were produced on Arches paper, numbered from 1 to 50 and from I to XV, and signed.

The *Enrajolats Series* includes 7 etchings with aquatint prints. A total of 30 prints were produced on Arches paper, numbered from 1 to 30 and from I to XV, and signed.

All the pieces featured in the exhibition are H.C. VI/XV, out of market prints reserved for the artist.

Both series were printed in 1979 by Joan Barbarà and published by Galeria Maeght in Barcelona. As well as the engraving entitled *Gran Rodona* I also present in the exhibition and whose edition is of 40 copies on Arches paper, justified from 1 to 30 and H.C. I to H.C. X, and signed.


















